What degree did you earn?

Where are you working right now? How did you choose your career path after graduation?

I work as the Assistant Director of SOM Career Services. My first job out of college was at PwC as a tax associate in the Tax Projects Delivery Group. I did not picture myself back in Binghamton or working in career services capacity, but I've always had a passion for helping people and psychology.

Would you please be able to provide some insight into the projects you are working on?
